Weekly Schedule:

Parents have the ability to become an **Observer** in a Canvas course and see coursework planned for students and their student's grades (above link). Observers can find additional information about navigating Canvas by clicking on this <u>Canvas Observer Guide</u>.

Grading and Student Progress: It is important for families to know that StudentVUE/ParentVUE are still available for student schedule and attendance information.

Also, on Progress Report Grading Day (Oct. 23) and on Trimester 1 Grading Day (Dec. 11), teachers will input the letter grade from Canvas into StudentVUE/ParentVUE for official reports at those two times of the term.

However, families should not anticipate using StudentVUE/ParentVUE for information on students' grades between reporting periods unless the teacher has indicated that they are using Synergy as well as Canvas. In fact, please be aware that StudentVUE/ParentVUE may *not* be synched to Canvas for many classes and may not provide an accurate picture of students' progress. In short, parents should plan to access students' grades through Canvas for the most accurate picture of students' progress during the trimester.

Drop-off and Pick-up of school items: In most weeks throughout Trimester 1, SEHS staff are available from 1pm-2pm at the east side of the building by the auditorium. Students or parents/guardians will be able to pick up textbooks and materials for specific classes during this time, as well as laptops, yearbooks, new student enrollment packets, free and reduced lunch applications, and Eugene library card applications.

OPEN AGAIN - FREE TREATMENT PROGRAM FOR TEEN DRUG USE

Adolescent and Family Services (AFS) is once again accepting new clients for enrollment in our no cost community resource for families dealing with teen drug use. We are following all COVID-19 safety precautions to keep everyone safe, and therapy sessions are currently being provided virtually via Telehealth. AFS, a clinic at the Oregon Social Learning Center, is providing an evidence-based drug and alcohol treatment for teens ages 12-18. With a grant from the National Institute on Drug Abuse, this treatment is provided at no cost to families as part of a research study. This family-based, outpatient counseling may be delivered in English or Spanish, and focuses on helping parents and youth learn new skills to deal with drug and alcohol problems. NUTRITION SERVICES

New Sites have been established for 2020-2021 and are up and running. http://www.4j.lane.edu/nutrition/

Eugene School District 4J is offering free meals 7 days a week for all 4J students and youth 18 years old and younger. Meals are available to grab-and-go from 10 sites across the district, from 10:45 a.m.–2 p.m. each school day. Daily meal menus are available online. Extra meals for the weekend are provided on Fridays.

The district also offers <u>home delivery of meals</u> to children who don't live near a meal pickup location or need assistance accessing meals.

To request delivery to your home within the Eugene School District please complete the <u>request</u> <u>form</u> in <u>English</u> or <u>Spanish</u>. Families who can't access the online form can call 541-790-7654. Requests made after October 5 are expected to be added to the daily delivery routes within 7–10 school days.

FREE LIBRARY CARD

Now all students in 4J schools can get a Eugene Public Library card for free—whether or not they live within the Eugene city limits.

Non-residents normally must pay an \$11 fee per month for a Eugene Public Library card. That fee is being waived for the several hundred 4J students who live outside the city limits, under a three-year pilot partnership of Eugene School District 4J, Eugene Public Library, and Eugene Public Library Foundation.

• This Week's Featured Scholarships:

The <u>Stamps Leadership Scholar University of Oregon</u> awards five renewable awards of \$125,000 over 4 years for full tuition, room, board, and more to outstanding Oregon students applying to the UO. Selection based on leadership, perseverance, scholarship, service, and innovation. Minimum 3.85 GPA. Automatic admission to Clark Honors College. No test scores for fall 2021 applicants. Application for UO admission due 11/1. Application for scholarship due 11/15. Requires transcript and four short-answer essay questions.

The National Security Language Initiative for Youth (NSLI-Y) offers over 660 merit-based scholarships for U.S. citizen high-school students between the ages of 15-18 to study a language in the summer or academic year. Recipients receive intensive language learning via classes, cultural activities, and living overseas with a host family. Programs offered in Arabic, Chinese (Mandarin), Hindi, Indonesian, Korean, Persian (Tajiki), Russian, or Turkish. NSLI-Y is a program of the U.S Dept. of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs. Covers travel, tuition, food, secondary medical insurance, and a modest stipend. Requires transcript, teacher recommendation, and parent statement. Minimum 2.5 GPA. Apply by 11/5.

- Oregon and Northwest Scholarship List
- <u>Full Tuition Scholarships at Oregon Colleges</u>. A full scholarship covers tuition and fees, often
 for more than one year, and may cover other college costs like housing and books. Although
 many of these scholarships are very competitive, Portland State University, Western Oregon
 University, and University of Oregon have programs open to all Pell-eligible Oregonians with a
 minimum GPA.

<u>College Application and Essay Assistance</u> from Pacific University admissions counselors (no need to apply to Pacific U to get help). Called PacU Pop-Ups, these assistance sessions take place every day of the week all fall.
