Parents have the ability to become an **Observer** in a Canvas course and see coursework planned for students and their student's grades by following instructions at the link above.

What is Canvas?

Canvas is the learning platform that all 4J high schools are using this year. Canvas is where students and parents can view all of the course content, assignments, grades, and announcements. As a parent, Canvas is the place where you can monitor your student's weekly progress in each course. You can view grades, assignments, and even how much time your student is spending logged in to each course.

How do I become an Observer in Canvas?

You will first need a pairing code. You can get this code from your student (instructions below), or from an SEHS Canvas administrator. It may be simplest to request the pairing code from your student, but there is also a request form below if your student is unable to provide the code. There are also instructions below on using the Canvas Parent App.

ATTENDANCE & GRADING

High Schools are making adjustments to how attendance is documented, and students should make certain that they access each of that day's classes within Canvas to be counted as present. Students continue to be expected to access synchronous classes via Zoom as well as engaging in modules in Canvas. On Advisory (Flex) Days, students should open up each of their courses in Canvas. Most attendance reporting will be done through the Attendance Team in the main office and attendance will be viewable in StudentVUE/ParentVUE. Each week on Monday afternoon, an automated phone call will go out to parents with information about the previous week's absences.

The last class day of Trimester 1 will be Thurs., December 10, and we encourage families to review student progress in Canvas by becoming an Observer in Canvas courses. Helpful information is linked [here](#).

Students seeking to withdraw from a course must do so this week and will have a WD recorded on their transcript with no credit awarded. It is important to note that there is not a guarantee that the student will be able to take the same course in a later term this year because not all courses are offered each term.

Students with an Incomplete from Trimester 1 last year (2019-2020) have until the end of this trimester to resolve their Incomplete.

GRADUATION

It is now time to begin the ordering process for the Class of 2021 Graduation. Due to the pandemic, the process to order will be done remotely. Orders need to be placed through Miners Graduate Services.

Orders need to be placed by Wednesday, December 9th, 2020. Orders placed after this date will be subject to late fees and product restrictions.

If you do not pay the exam fee by the to be determined designated deadline or decide not to take the exam, the exam will be cancelled. There will be a reduced exam fee for those who qualify for free or reduced meals. If you need assistance paying for the exam fee, please contact your student's counselor. - **Upcoming South-Supported Scholarships** (due dates in parentheses): **Unified Caring Association Scholarship** (11/30); **Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange (CBYX) Scholarship** (12/1); **National Honor Society** (12/1); **Oregon Opportunity Grant** (12/1); **Generation Google** (12/1); **LEDA Scholarship Program** (12/14); **Equitable Excellence Scholarship** (12/15); **Kaiser Permanente Health Care Career Scholarship** (12/23).
- **This Week's Featured Scholarships:** The **Oregon Opportunity Grant** is Oregon's largest state-funded, need-based grant program for students attending college at an Oregon school. Approximately 40,000 students receive Opportunity Grants each year. Awards range from \$2,800 for students attending community college to \$3,600 for students attending four-year college. Apply by filing the FAFSA as soon as possible. There is no firm application deadline because grants are awarded until funds are exhausted on a first-come, first-served basis. **Generation Google** awards \$10,000 to students interested in computer science who are from historically underrepresented groups, including Black/African American, Hispanic/Latinx, American Indian, or Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander. Selection based on financial need and a commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion. Also based on demonstrated leadership and academic performance. Requires resume, financial information, transcript, and three short-answer essays. Apply by 12/1.
