This Week's Featured Scholarships: Local South-Only Scholarships!! Four scholarships for only South Eugene seniors are coming due 5/17. Check out whether you can apply to any of these.

- [First Generation MAPS Scholarship](#) -- \$500 scholarship for an SEHS student who is the **first of any generation in their family** to attend 2-year or 4-year college. GPA and financial need considered, as well as extracurricular activities, community service, work experience, leadership roles, awards, and honors. Essay and letter of recommendation required. Submit completed application to Lori Sauter (sauter_l@4j.lane.edu) by 5/10/21.

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- [SEHS Alumni Scholarship](#) – Three \$3,000 awards to SEHS students **attending an accredited 4-year college or university**. Requires a 300-word essay, an unofficial transcript, the Student Aid Report from the FAFSA, and a list of activities and work experience. Financial need is considered.
 - [Alison Wheeler Memorial Scholarship](#) -- \$500 award to an SEHS student interested in **studying science or technology** at a 4-year college or university. Requires minimum 3.0 GPA, resume, at least 80 hours of community service, and a 300-word essay.
 - [Robert Stothers Scholarship for Future Teachers](#) – Two \$2,000 awards to SEHS seniors **pursuing a degree in education**. Requires minimum 2.75 GPA, one emailed letter of recommendation, an unofficial transcript, and an essay.
 - [SEHS Staff Scholarship](#) – Two \$2,000 awards to SEHS students **attending a two-year community, vocational, or technical college**. Considers financial need, activities, community service, honors and work experiences. Requires application, transcript, letter of recommendation, and Student Aid Report from the FAFSA.
