CLASS SCHEDULES

September 30, 2021 is the last day for students to DROP a course without having a withdrawal "WD" recorded on their transcript.

Please use the <u>Tri 1 Course Correction Form</u> that can be found on the <u>Scheduling website</u>. **The Drop form is for 11th and 12th grades only.** Students must use their 4j email to gain access to the form. Students are expected to attend all classes as scheduled unless they see a change confirmed in StudentVUE/ParentVUE.

CANVAS OBSERVER

 Questbridge National College Match for Seniors (9/28); Golden Door Scholars (10/4); P.E.O. STAR (10/15).
- This Week's Featured Scholarship: The Questbridge National College Match for Seniors is a college and scholarship application process that helps outstanding low-income students gain admission and full four-year scholarships to the nation's most selective colleges. College Match Scholarships, provided by participating colleges, cover tuition, room and board, are loan-free and require no parental contribution to 40 top-tier universities. For families earning less than \$65,000/year for a family of four. Citizenship *not* required. Apply by 9/28.

Multicultural Fly-In Programs: Many colleges like to connect with juniors and seniors from historically underrepresented populations by flying them (for free) to their campuses, sharing college information, and showing off their schools. If you know where you might like to attend next year, look on those schools' websites to see if they offer a fly-in or other outreach program. These programs can really help high-school students prepare for college life.

10/1: First day to submit the <u>FAFSA</u>. Any senior intending to continue their education after high school, regardless of type of school, should fill out the FAFSA <u>with one parent</u>. This application for financial aid is used by the federal government, state government, schools, and private donors to select scholarship/financial-aid recipients. Don't miss out! (Hint: Start by having the student create one <u>FSAID</u> and the appropriate parent create a separate one.)

10/3: Harvard, Princeton, UVA, Wellesley, and Yale virtual information session from 4-5:15 pm PDT. Reps will discuss academic programs, campus life, selective college admissions and financial aid. Juniors: Register for the PSAT!

On October 13th, SEHS will be conducting our annual College and Career Readiness Day. On this day all 10th graders will take the PSAT (Preliminary SAT) and 11th graders can opt in and register to take the PSAT/NMSQT (The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test). Juniors need to sign up by October 6th. Sophomores do not need to register as they will be automatically assigned to take the test.

Juniors who do not participate in the PSAT will join 12th graders in post high school planning workshops and info sessions. Our 9th graders will also have grade level activities that they will be working on during that day.
