Free or reduced-price school meals:

More than 40 percent of 4J students qualify for free or reduced-price school meals. You qualify if your household income is at or below the federal guidelines, or if your family receives food stamps, TANF, or FDPIR—even if your situation is short-term, such as a temporary layoff. The program is confidential, easy, and good for both your budget and your child’s school.

Sometimes families hesitate to apply for the school meal program because they don’t want to strain their school’s resources. Not to worry! The school district receives federal reimbursement for free and reduced-price meals, and individual schools can receive additional federal funding based on how many students qualify for the program. If you fill out a form and qualify, you are helping both your family and your school. To learn more and apply online, go to www.4j.lane.edu/nutrition/freelunch.

The benefits go beyond savings on school meals. Here are just a few of the opportunities available to students and families who qualify for free or reduced-price school meals:

Drivers Training Scholarships: Check with the Finance Office when your student registers for a session with Oregon Driver Training Institute for scholarship information.

Reduced fees for sports, activities and summer camps: Your student can qualify for significant fee reductions on 4J athletics and activity fees. Other organizations that offer reduced registration fees for youth recreation and enrichment programs include KidSports and The City of Eugene.

Aid for college-bound students: Students who qualify for the school meal program can receive a fee reduction or waiver for SAT, ACT, Advanced Placement and IB tests. They also can receive free additional score reports for some tests and can request a waiver or deferral of application fees at many colleges. Talk to your high school Counseling Department to learn more.

LTD Transit Pass:

All students in 4J schools can get a student pass to ride Lane Transit District (LTD) buses for free. Student transit passes can be used to travel anywhere within the LTD service area. Student passes can be used at any time—after school, on weekends and during school breaks, as well as to get to and from school each day.

Get a free LTD student transit pass at Back to Business or ask the front office staff. 4J elementary and middle school students will need parent/guardian permission to receive a student transit pass. Ask your elementary and middle school for the permission form. Passes are valid from [September 1, 2022](#) to [September 30, 2023](#) and can be renewed by the school each year for ongoing free service.
